The only European-based engineer brigade, the 7th Engineers was reactivated under the 21st Theater Sustainment Command to increase engineer command and control capability for U.S. Army Europe and Africa. We have an exciting mission providing engineer support to U.S. European Command and NATO operations and exercises, which is sure to make for a rewarding assignment.

The 7th Engineers has a rich lineage being forged in combat in June 1944 on Biak Island, Philippines to support all aviation construction in the Pacific Theater during World War II. The Brigade's European journey began in 1952 as an engineer aviation brigade stationed near Frankfurt, Germany. The Brigade was assigned to VII Corps in 1969 and moved near Stuttgart, Germany. In 1990, the Brigade deployed with VII Corps to Saudi Arabia in support of Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm. Upon its return to Germany, the brigade began inactivation and officially inactivated in January 1992. Since its inception during World War II, the Brigade's motto has been "Engineers – Lead the Way!"
