A native of Vicksburg, Mississippi, COL Anthony M. King began his military service in 1992 as a Pharmacy Technician (91Q). In 1996, he graduated from Jackson State University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology and was commissioned in the Medical Service Corps. Prior to arriving, COL King served as the Deputy Corps Chief of the Medical Service Corps, Falls Church, Virginia.
