Colonel Kurt Rorvik is a native of Seattle, WA. He began his Army career in 1993 as an 11B Infantryman Enlisted Soldier. Upon completion of his enlisted service, Colonel Rorvik attended the Army ROTC program at the University of Washington in Seattle, WA. He commissioned in 1999 and served on Active Duty until 2003, before transitioning to the Army National Guard (ARNG). Colonel Rorvik served as a Dual Status Military Technician at Camp Murray, WA for nearly 10 years, before transferring to the ARNG Title 10 AGR program, serving at National Guard Bureau (NGB) and other federal assignments.

Colonel Rorvik's career assignments have included with Headquarters Department of the Army, G-3/5/7 Mobilization Division (DAMO-ODM), and in the Chief of National Guard Bureau's Chief's Action Group (CAG) at the Pentagon in Washington, DC. He served as Commander of the Mission Training Complex (MTC) at Fort Leavenworth, KS, and as the SIG Chief for the ARNG G-3/5/7 Directorate, and the Chief of the NGB-J33 Current Operations Division at National Guard Bureau in Arlington, VA. His most recent assignment was as the Deputy Chief of Staff and Senior Guard Advisor for the Alaskan Command (ALCOM) at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, AK, in support of Homeland Defense of the North American Continent. Colonel Rorvik deployed twice to Iraq, from 2004-2005 and again from 2008-2009.

Colonel Rorvik is a graduate of the US Naval War College, the Defense Strategy Course, and the School of Advanced Military Studies, and has earned master's degrees from Chapman University College, the US Army Command and General Staff College, the University of Colorado Denver, and the US Naval War College.

Colonel Rorvik's awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Bronze Star Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal (with One Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster), the Meritorious Service Medal (with Four Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters), the Expert Infantryman's Badge, Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Army Staff Identification Badge, and National Guard Bureau Identification Badge.
